Paul was born at Tarsus in Cilicia about 10 A.D. of Jewish parents. He was educated in Jewish Law by Gamaliel, the great religious teacher of his time. Paul was also a Roman citizen.

Paul is distinguished as one of the great apostles of Jesus Christ whom he proclaimed with great zeal as the great teacher and saviour of mankind. He is known as a great missionary who travelled to different places in Asia Minor, Greece and Rome, inspiring people by his words and deeds. He was a prolific writer who has written 14 epistles to the early Christian communities, guiding them in their faith and encouraging them to lead an exemplary life.

Paul was a teacher par excellence. He was well acquainted not only with Jewish religion but also with Greek and Roman culture. He taught people how to find God in various circumstances of their life.

ST. PAUL'S COLLEGE

Recommendation to Parents/Guardians

- Parents are expected to co-operate with the college authorities and the teachers by enforcing regularity, punctuality and discipline, supervising the lessons, taking active part in College activities and by sending their wards in proper and complete uniform.
- Occasional remarks from the Principal and the teachers are written in the college diary for the information and action of the parents. In such cases they should never fail to sign the diary to show their acknowledgment of the same.
- 3. Parents are expected to sign the note books whenever they are sent for. Failure to do so may put their children into a great inconvenience. They should particularly check their leave and absence records.
- 4. When communicating with the Principal, parents/ guardians are requested to mention in their letter the name of the student, class and section.
- 5. Parents are strictly forbidden to meet their children and the teacher in the class or the staff member in the staff room without the permission of the Principal.
- 6. Giving tips (money) to college workers either during or after the college hours is strictly forbidden.
- 7. Parents must inform the college office whenever their residential address or telephone numbers are changed in order to communicate to them in urgent matters, in the interest of their children.
- 8. Answer papers of the examination will be shown to the parents. Application for verification of marks in special cases will be considered at the discretion of Principal. Answer scripts of the final examination will not be shown to the parents.

- Parents should insist on their children to devote enough time to learn their lessons before they come to college.
 On holidays some time should be devoted to study at home.
- 10. If parents or guardians find that their ward is not picking up right habits or is not progressing satisfactorily in his/her studies, they should make an appointment with the Principal to discuss the matter.
- 11. Parents are requested not to send for or call away their children during class hours except in case of unforeseen emergency and that too with the Principal's permission.
- 12. Parents should understand that they cannot dictate to the Principal but that the Principal has the right to say on what conditions he will admit or retain pupils in the institution.
- 13. Principal must be informed of the absence of the students at the earliest.
- 14. Should there be any infectious disease at home the same should be reported to the Principal at once and not send the child to the class till the child is fully cured. Doctor's Certificate to attend the class must be brought on the day the child is fit to join the college.
- 15. If a student is likely to be absent due to illness for a long period, the Principal must be informed immediately through an application along with Medical Certificate with the name, class and section of their ward.
- 16. Parents/Guardians are requested not to give money to children unless they receive a written notice from the school. Children should be provided with tiffin lunch.
- 17. Parents/Guardians are requested to send their wards to college in full, complete, clean and tidy uniform and on time.
- 18. Tuitions are strongly discouraged. Parents who want their wards to be admitted in this college and look out

- for tutors, are taking a risk as they will depend on the sincerity of the tutors. Parents who have no time to give personal attention to their children should not admit or retain their children in this college.
- 19. In spite of all help given, a child fails to show any progress, the same may be discussed with the Principal, Class/Subject Teachers and the Principal may permit extra coaching by a member of the staff.
- 20. To ensure integrity and dedication of the member of the staff, the following are the guidelines to the staff and parents/guardian in regard to private tuitions:
 - (a) No member of the staff of this institution may undertake tuition without the sanction of the Principal.
 - (b) No staff member of this institution is permitted to visit the homes of the children to give tuition, or suggest the need of private tuition.
 - (c) A parent/Guardian desirous of arranging a private tuition from a member of this institution shall apply in writing to the Principal, who after ascertaining the merit of the application, will forward it to any member of the staff. The parents and teacher will accept the terms and conditions of the assignment from the Principal before commencing with tuition work.
 - (d) It is to be clearly understood by both parents and tutors that coaching is an exception. It is primarily to help the child to gain confidence and right habit of study and as soon as the child is able to cope up with his/her studies, tuition should be discontinued.
 - (e) A teacher who values tuition work more than her/ his dedication to duty and his/her work suffers, put himself/herself in danger of having his/her service to this institution, terminated. Parents are requested not to bring pressure on a teacher in this regard

- but be conscious and fair in their dealing in the matter.
- (f) All tuition work shall end a week before the examinations commence.
- 21. Criticism of the teacher or of the college in the presence of children should be avoided because it causes them to lose respect to those teachers and consequently fail to learn from them. Should a parent have genuine complaint it may be brought to the notice of the Principal.
- 22. Parents are exhorted not to listen to unwarranted gossips and spread the same as it causes untold damage to the institution. Let us remember that to build an institution requires many years of effort but to destroy, it can take only a day.
- 23. Parents should always keep in mind that the college, its teachers and the parents are linked together in a continuous process for the education of the child. Even in difficult situations calm and gentleness should be displayed so that the atmosphere is cordial, realizing that the net result of mutual accusations fall ultimately on the child. If the relation with the college is not cordial, it is advisable for parents to shift their children to other institution of their choice.

Courses of Study

From Nursery to Class X, General Education is provided in all the subjects. For classes XI and XII the College provides courses of study in English, Hindi, Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Mathematics, Computer Science and SUPW.

Admission

NURSERY:

Admissions are open to Nursery for children who complete 3 years 6 months ($3\frac{1}{2}$ yrs) on 1st April of the academic year.

The Procedure:

(a) Application forms will be made available at the college office for a period which will be notified on the college

notice board. The Application forms should be returned to the office duly filled by a specified date notified on the Notice Board and follow the instructions of the office.

- (b) The Application form should be submitted along with:
 - (i) An attested copy of Date of birth certificate from:
 - (A) Nagar Mahapalika
 - (B) The Maternity Hospital
 - (C) Baptism Certificate (for Christians)
 - (ii) 3 latest passport-size photographs.

OTHER CLASSES:

Generally no admissions are taken to other classes as children from lower classes are promoted to the respective higher classes.

However, if some vacancies arise due to withdrawals, opportunity is provided to those who seek admission to other classes.

The procedure:

- (a) A written application on a plain paper accompanied by an attested copy of the final exam report card of the school last attended should be deposited in the college office by hand/post.
- (b) Vacancies, if any, will be notified on the NOTICE BOARD.
- (c) Only those who apply for those classes which have vacancies will then be asked to appear for the Entrance Test.
- (d) The Principal reserves the right to admit or to refuse admission to anybody at any time without assigning any reason for his action.
- (e) No admission will be done unless a T.C. from a recognised school is submitted. Those coming from outside the District should have their T.C. countersigned by the competent Education Authority of that place. In

- no case shall the child be considered to a class higher than the one stated in the Transfer Certificate. The Principal has the right to say on what condition he will admit.
- (f) The important condition for admission is that the Parents/Guardians comply strictly with the school rules and regulations and cooperate with the school for the welfare of the institution, give sufficient time and care for their wards.
- (g) The date of birth of a student once entered in the College records will not be changed. The parents/guardians will have to sign an undertaking to this effect.

Withdrawal

- A month's notice for withdrawal must be given in writing, duly acknowledged, to the office, or a month's fee must be paid before the withdrawal of a candidate. Generally, it takes a week's time after submitting the withdrawal form to issue the T.C.
- 2. Every application for T.C. should be made in writing on the prescribed form obtainable from the office by parent/ quardian.
- 3. No T.C. will be granted unless all school dues have been cleared and "NO DUES CERTIFICATE" is obtained from the fee counter, Librarian, Laboratory-in-charge, etc.

Attendance, Leave & Absence

- A minimum attendance of 75% of the working days is required for promotion. Students should come in time for the general assembly. Late comers are liable to be sent home.
- 2. No student should leave the college premises during the college hours without the written permission of the Principal which is granted on the written request of the parents.

- 3. No leave of absence for the whole day or a part is granted except for serious reasons and only on the previous written application of the parents/guardians.
- 4. A student who is irregular to classes due to feasts, marriage celebrations, trips, visits to relations and places and frequent late comers will be asked to discontinue.
- 5. Except for duly approved reasons, extension of vacation is not permitted. Students who extend their holidays after vacation without sanction will have their names struck-off the rolls, and vacancies, if any, will be filled with fresh applicants.
- 6. Application for medical leave for more than 3 days should be accompanied by a medical certificate by a doctor who is an MBBS. If this leave continues for more than seven days, the Principal must be contacted.
- 7. All leave applications should bear the signature of the parent or in his/her absence, of the guardian. Failure to bring such an application for leave, makes the student liable to be sent home.
- 8. A student who is absent from the class continuously for 10 days or more without the leave sanctioned by the Principal may have his/her name struck-off the rolls without any notice. If re-admitted he/she will have to pay the full admission and other fees for the period of such absence.
- 9. All leave applications should be forwarded to the Principal before going on leave and not after joining the school. Leave has to be sanctioned by the Principal.

Examination and Promotion Rules

 On examination days no student is allowed to enter the examination hall or classroom before the general assembly.

- 2. No leave other than medical leave is sanctioned during examination period, provided a medical certificate from such medical authority as will satisfy the Principal is submitted on the day the student is absent so that appropriate entries may be made in the college records.
- 3. Any other leave applied for and taken during the examination will be at the risk of the parents and will not be taken into consideration in determining promotion.
- 4. In any case, a medical certificate is not a guarantee for granting promotion. If a student falls sick for a part or the whole examination he should have the required pass marks from the other examinations held during the year.
- 5. Examination will not be anticipated for individual students. Examination once missed will not be conducted again for any reason.
- 6. Candidates will be disqualified if they are detected in giving or obtaining or attempting to give or obtain unfair assistance at the examination or if they have in their possession while in the examination hall or classroom, any book, memorandum or pocket book, notes or paper except the question paper of the current exam. Unused answer sheets must be submitted to the staff-invigilators.
- 7. Final results once decided will not be re-considered. All cases of doubt regarding promotion are left entirely to the discretion of the Principal. Parents must not approach for re-consideration of the Result. In no case shall a student be promoted on trial.
- 8. Parents/Guardians must sign the report card when it is sent for and return it the next day.
- 9. The College does not undertake to retain answer scripts for more than 7 days after distributing the report cards.

- 10. Promotion to the higher class is based on the annual aggregate that takes the whole year's performance through examinations.
- 11. If some parents feel that justice has not being done to their wards in scrutinizing the answer-scripts, the same can be brought to the notice of the Principal. At his sole discretion he may have the answer-scripts re-checked for a stipulated fee.
- 12. The evaluation of answer scripts and other works done by the students during the examination is within the domestic jurisdiction of the college and therefore, no outside person or authority has jurisdiction to check, scrutinize or evaluate the answer scripts or other work done by the students.
- 13. It is compulsory for all the students to appear for the school based examinations.

Fees

- This is an unaided minority College and does not receive any grant from the government or any other agency and the only income of the College is the fees realized from the students. Hence it becomes necessary to increase the fees from time to time to meet the increase in the salary of teachers and increase in the cost of maintenance.
- 2. If the fees are not paid by the last working day of the instalment, the name of the defaulter may be struck off from the college register.
- 3. Students withdrawn from the College during the year without notice of withdrawal to the College will be required to pay the fees for the whole term, notwithstanding the fact that the child has not attended the College during that period.
- 4. Students will not be allowed to appear for all the examinations unless all dues are paid.

- 5. No exemption or reduction in fees will be made on account of holiday or absence for any cause.
- 6. Details of the fees are given in the fee booklet.

Science Laboratories

- 1. No equipment or chemicals, except the ones provided for the practical, should be handled by the students.
- 2. Damage to the equipment or breakage will have to be compensated by the students concerned. All dues must be cleared before the final examination.
- 3. Under penalty of exclusion from the practical classes for a period of time or any other penalty that the Principal deems fit, students are warned not to take any equipment or chemical out of the laboratories without the explicit permission of the Teacher-in-charge.

Co-Curricular Activities

- The College attaches great importance to games, cocurricular activities and competitions and all the students are exhorted to take part in them. Children selected for Dramatics, Elocution, Debates, Art and Craft competitions, S.U.P.W. projects must willingly spare time for such activities.
- Participation in the Inter-house activities and attendance at school functions when called upon to do so, is obligatory. The Principal can take action against those students who absent themselves from such activities.
- 3. Students should learn to play games in a pure team spirit and in a spirit of sportsmanship, remembering at all times that behaviour on the field is as important as in the class-room.
- 4. Parents are requested to encourage their children to participate in the co-curricular activities for their integral formation. When they absent themselves without reason,

they may be penalised and debarred from further participation in such activities.

General Rules of Discipline

- 1. Students are to contribute to the high standard of the College by their manners and general good behaviour. Hence, for the smooth running of the College, no student should bring to College any object liable to prove a source of disturbance.
- 2. As far as posture, cleanliness, silence, politeness, honesty, attention to work and respect to teachers and companions are concerned, the college should be looked upon as a place of reverence and discipline.
- 3. Absolute silence must be maintained at all places during the teaching hours, especially computer room, the general assembly or on the way to and from the classrooms.
- 4. Respect for one's property as well as for that of the college and for the things belonging to others is a mark of a well-bred and responsible student. Furniture, teaching aids and charts should be kept in their respective places after use. Any kind of damage done in the college premises must be compensated.
- 5. It is compulsory to speak English in the college premises in order to facilitate the students the use the medium of instruction. They should maintain a high standard in their conversation.
- 6. No mobiles, other books, news papers, periodicals, pictures, games articles, transistors or any electrical instruments not pertaining to their daily use, should be brought to college without the class teacher's/Principal's permission. If detected or found to have bad influence on the fellow students, these will be confiscated and students found guilty may be punished.

- 7. The college does not accept responsibility for the loss of books, money, stationery etc. Each student is responsible for his/her own things. Bringing of valuables like gold to the college is not permitted.
- 8 The Principal may chastise a student for habitual idleness, disobedience or misconduct which are injurious to the moral tone of the college, by detention after class hours or by other works. He may even dismiss a student or ask him to discontinue if he is guilty of serious matters.
- 9. No fines or collection for any purpose what-so-ever may be made without the previous sanction of the Principal, so also presentation of gifts to members of the staff requires previous sanction.
- In the absence of the teachers, the class monitor/ monitress assumes responsibility for order and discipline of the class. He/She should fulfil his/her duty with loyalty and impartiality.
- 11. Students who are given responsibility should carry it out dutifully and impartially and in accordance with the discretion of the Principal or the teacher deputed by him. They should consider it as a service to the college and to their fellow students.
- 12. Students can always approach the Principal individually for any reasonable or sympathetic consideration and not collectively.
- 13. No student may take private tuition in any subject from any member of the college staff without the written permission of the Principal. All such tuitions must be discontinued one week before the examinations.
- 14. The General Assembly is the most important part of the college day. Every student should be present to begin the day with prayer to God, and listen to the important announcements. At the first bell all must gather on the assembly grounds for the Assembly where

- they will pray in common and thereafter move silently to their classrooms.
- 15. They should be friendly, courteous and cooperative towards other students of the college, treating everyone with respect and conducting themselves in a dignified manner.
- 16. All must come to college on time, neatly dressed with lessons well prepared and home work done. Text and exercise books and material for drawing, S.U.P.W., art and craft, should be brought to school according to the day's routine.
- 17. Students are to attend the school in complete and clean uniform, short and combed hair, clean shaven, polished shoes and trimmed nails.
- 18. They should be obedient and loyal to the college and the teachers. They should desist from making derogatory comments against the college and teachers on social media.
- 19. Any pupil who is persistently insubordinate or repeatedly and wilfully mischievous or is guilty of other malpractices in connection with examinations or has committed an offence of serious indiscipline/misbehaviour or who in the opinion of the Principal, has an unhealthy influence on his fellow students, may be suspended for a specified period or expelled permanently from the college.
- 20. A student may also be expelled permanently from the college for assaulting a teacher, seriously attacking a fellow student, persistent rude behaviour towards teacher and in the opinion of the Principal has a demoralizing influence on fellow students.
- 21. Students repeatedly coming late or forgetting to bring books or coming without the proper uniform may be sent home.

Parent-Teacher Meeting

- 1. Parent-Teacher Meetings are held regularly.
- 2. Parents/Guardians are requested to make use of this opportunity to meet the teachers and discuss the progress of their children. This will enable the teachers to understand the children better and consequently pay special attention to their needs.
- 3. These meetings are contact meetings because the college, teachers and parents are involved in the education of the child. These are also occasions for the parents to let the teacher know that they do care for her/his effort and the progress of their child.
- 4. As far as possible all requests to meet the teacher to discuss the courses or any other matter pertaining to studies, should be kept for the Parent-Teacher Meeting. In urgent cases the Principal's permission is needed to meet the teachers in the college.

- 1. The college Managing Committee reserves the right to waive off any of the rules contained in this prospectus without assigning any reason for its action.
- 2. The final interpretation of any rule of this prospectus as well as any amendment to it rests solely and entirely with the Managing Committee of the college. Its interpretation shall be final and binding on parents and students of this institution and no case shall lie in any court of law in respect of its decision.
